



Context:

"Weather" is a topic of great interest the world over, especially considering the growing awareness of climate change. In this activity, students will learn how different weather conditions affect our daily lives. Preparation:

Print out the A4 sheets.

Stick the top and bottom half of the game board together. If possible, laminate the game board and cover the pages of "weather cards" with 'clear pvc self adhesive film'. Then cut out the squares to make the cards. We have left some cards blank in case you want to make your own.

HOW TO PLAY:

You need four people, one game board and two sets of cards (different colour borders).

Work with a partner to make a team of two.

Shuffle your team cards and place them in a pile face down.

Take turns to turn over your top card and decide where to put it on the board. Everyone has to agree that the card fits the statement on the board.

The team with the first four cards in a line either vertically, horizontally or diagonally wins.

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
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




Weather - Game Board






