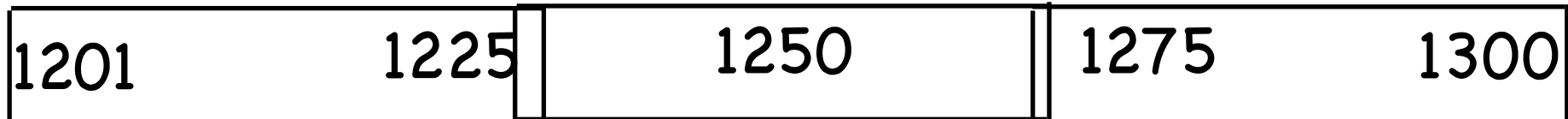
Anglo Saxon Timeline Activity

Seventeen pupils need a blank sheet of A4 which they fold lengthwise into three. We have printed some instructions below for you to try out so they can work together on this to reduce teacher talk.



They then cut the page into three horizontal strips and stick them together to make a long thin strip.

They are each given a century card and divide their 100 years into four sections writing the dates on the strip. Here is the example of the 13th Century.



Meanwhile the rest of the class prepare their events cards: instructions below. We have provided seventeen in case you have a large class so is one for each century. With a smaller class you can decide to leave out the centuries that no classes have studied so far nor are likely to until they reach KS3.

Then you will need some space for the next stage - if you adapt this activity for the Stone Age you will need the playground! The "century" pupils get themselves in order from 401 CE to 2099 CE and hold out their timeline in front of them. The events pupils find the date where they belong. You might want to extend this for later group work where two century pupils and their linked events could research another event to add to the timeline or they could do an assembly so that older pupils could contribute events from the history they have learned.

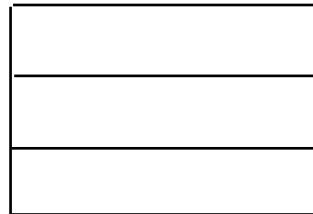

Century Cards

Instructions for Century Cards Holders

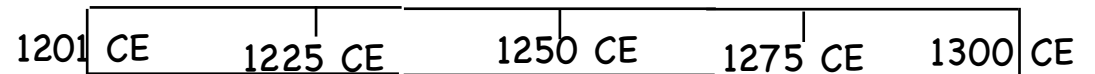
1. Fold your paper horizontally. Then cut your paper into three lengths.



2. Glue the lengths together to make one long strip. This is now your timeline!

3. Mark your five dates along your timeline.

4. Decide whose timeline comes before you and whose comes after you.



This example is the thirteenth century.
