
Hodgeheg Games

There is no convincing evidence that the study of traditional nor modern descriptive grammars improve children's speaking and listening (and we don't think it has much impact on reading and writing either!) but there is evidence that language games are both popular with children and very effective at developing language awareness and promoting good discussion. Since this story has been around a long time and often used as a class reader at the beginning of KS2, here are a couple of language games which we hope you will try out and then come up with better versions to share with us.

Hedgehogs are in short supply in our neck of the woods, although there are still fifty or so foraging around Regents Park. Apparently they have learned not to try to leave. Have they become collaborative and started talking to each other??


Dick King Smith's hedgehogs are very different from real hedgehogs in that they are sociable animals. Hedgehogs are normally solitary.

We have just added a work in progress activity scaffolding joint construction of an instruction sheet for hedgehogs (and hodgehegs).






How to Play Nump on the Bose: a game for two or three or two pairs of players.


Each player has a figure outline with parts of the body labels and a hedgehog outline.

Place the injury cards upside down spread out or shuffled and placed in a pile.

Take turns to throw the die.

If you throw an even number you can pick a card. Translate your card and place it on the correct part of the body outline.

If you throw an odd number you can draw one extra thing on your hedgehog outline to produce your perfect hedgehog portrait. Please send your portraits to us for publishing on this activity.



How to Play Pedgehog Hairs: a game for two or three or two pairs of players.



Crossing the Road Safely - Humans and Hedgehogs

I have put together a little set of information sheets on some of the different ways pedestrians can safely cross the road. It proved quite tricky and it's easy to understand why folk fail their theoretical driving test. Also here is a checklist to decide how hedgehog friendly a human crossing can be. Mare instruction sheets on other ways of crossing the road are invited e.g. the 3D zebra crosssing!

The aim here is for the sheets to act as scaffolding for children to invent their own hedgehog friendly crossing and write/draw an information sheet to explain its workings.



Zebra Crossing



How to Use a Zebra Crossing

- 1. Stop at the edge of the crossing on the pink non slip pavement.
- 2. Look to the right and look to the left.
- 3. If there is no traffic walk across. Do not run.
- 4. If there is traffic, wait until it stops completely in both directions.
- 5. Walk across. Do not run. Wave a thank you to the drivers.

Lights to Stop Grippy Roadway to help cars stop Traffic quickly.




Button to Press Zig Zags

How to Use a Pelican Crossing

- 1. Stop at the edge of the crossing on the pink non slip pavement.
- 2. Press the button on the post.
- 3. Wait until the traffic stops and the green person appears.
- 4. Walk across. Do not run. Wave a thank you to the drivers.
- 5. Do not start to cross when the light is flashing amber.

Pelican crossings are slowly being made in to Puffins!



- 1. Stop at the edge of the crossing on the pink non-slip pavement.
- 2. Press the button on the post where you will see a red person.
- 3. Wait until the traffic stops and a green person appears on the post.
- 4. Walk across. Do not run. Wave a thank you to the drivers.
- 5. The light will not change until you have crossed. Puffin crossings are clever and can detect you while you are crossing!

How to Use a Toucan/Zebra Crossing

1. Stop at the edge of the crossing on the pink non slip pavement.



- 4. If there is traffic, wait until it stops completely in both directions.
- 5. Walk or cycle across. Do not run. Wave a thank you to the drivers.

This button is high up




Red and Green Horse

How to Use a Pegasus Crossing

- 1. Ride your horse to the edge of the crossing
- 2. Press the red horse button on the post.
- 3. Wait until the traffic stops and the green horse appears.
- 4. Ride across. Do not gallop or trot. Wave a thank you to the drivers.
