We also have a bingo game like simile bingo: two boards and two sets of matching cards. This could also be made into a bingo game.

Working on the poem reminded us of other monster poems: some frivolous and some deeper, like Robert Graves' Welsh Incident. It also invited work on building vocabulary around words of motion. So far here are two glossing minibooks and a bingo activity going a little beyond the poem. We may use our alien drawings produced for us in Nottingham schools about ten years ago and we hope you will send us yours.

'No, no.'


